

A Guide To Your Pet's Poop

Stool Colour



Dark Colour

Dark colour is usually indicated with the ingestion of dark coloured meat. If you see darker coloured poop after feeding dark meats, that is totally ok! Healthily-formed dark stool is just fine.



Light Colour

Light colour is often seen when you feed lighter coloured meat. It also occurs when you feed more bone to your pet. This totally fine as long as the consistency is good and there is not a problem passing the stool

Stool Consistency



Hard Consistency

Usually happen with increased bone ingestion. If your pet starts having hard, dry poops that are crumbly and hard to pass, it's an indicator that you're feeding too much bone



Soft Consistency

Soft poo is ok from time to time, but if it's really soft on a regular basis, you might not be feeding enough bone in the diet. Animals who can't eat raw bone will need a calcium supplement to get enough calcium in a raw diet



Constipation

If you have this issue, you'll need to increase the fibre in your pet's diet and most likely, decrease the amount of bone you're feeding. Do it slowly and observe.



Diarrhea

Diarrhea is watery stool that may come one urgently, explosively, often with GI discomfort. Chronic water stool isn't normal either and a big red flag that your pet needs gut support.
